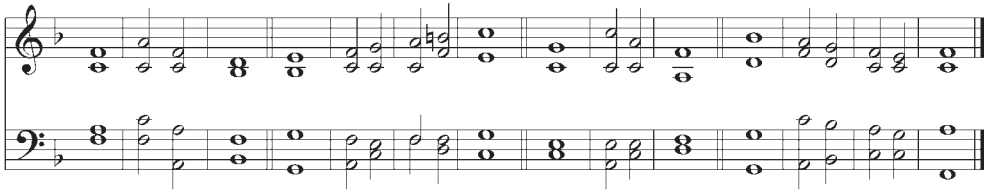


O Clap Your Hands Together, All Ye People
