### II. Creation, Sin, Judgment

A. Creation (Rev 4:11)

*God is the loving ruler of the world. He made the world. He made us rulers of the world under him.*

Associated with this basic observation is Revelation 4:11 –

*You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for you created all things, and by your will they exist and were created.*

## B. Sin (Rom 3:10-12)

*We all reject the ruler – God – by trying to run life our own way without him. But we fail to rule ourselves or society or the world.*



Scripture associated with this point:

*“As it is written: “There is none righteous, no, not one; There is none who understands; There is none who seeks after God. They have all turned aside...” (Romans 3:10–12)*

## C. Judgment (Heb 9:27 cf.

*God won't let us rebel forever. God's punishment for rebellion is death and judgment.*

*It is appointed for men to die once and after this to face judgment.*
