- Jesus Teaches His Disciples To Pray - Why are they asking Jesus to teach them to pray?
- Prayer is:
- Features of the prayer:
 - a. Jesus gave them a prayer, not an outline for prayer, not a theology of prayer.
 - b. The prayer is brief.
 - c. The primary focus of the prayer is on the sanctifying/hallowing of God's name through his coming kingdom.
 - d. This is a corporate prayer.
- The Lord's Prayer
 - "Father"
 - Who is "the son?"
 - Who calls God "Father?"
 - "hallowed be your name"
 - This a petition and not an ascription.
 - What are we asking when we are asking for God's name to be hallowed?
 - "your kingdom come"
 - "Our bread for the coming day keep giving us day by day."
 - "Forgive us our sins"
 - "Lead us not into testing"
